Intercultural programming and cross-cultural training are two critical services we continue to be proud of at International Student and Scholar Services, and this publication highlights the work done in these two areas in the 2023-24 academic year. This academic year saw almost 5,000 students and parents attend New International Student Experience events, and a growth in the number of intercultural trainings ISSS was able to offer throughout the year. In total, close to 10,000 faculty, staff, students, scholars, and parents attended an ISSS program or training in 2023-24, demonstrating the clear need and desire for these events from the campus and community.

The Training and Programs branch of ISSS was created as a commitment to the international population of the campus that programming would remain a priority for the office and the university. Regardless of how many resources were needed to be committed to ever changing immigration and visa issues, ISSS would not lose sight of the fact that our students and scholars are here for a fully rounded international educational experience, and that means social and cultural events that enhance both the campus and the student experience. While the programming we do continues to evolve, the ideas we built the branch on remain consistent. Create programs that meet clearly defined goals. 


# TRAINING














### WISCONSIN DELLS SUMMER BREAK TRIP
